Taking place from 6:00pm – 8:00pm at the Barbados Tourism Marketing Inc offices in London, the Vision 2023 event will see BAME Women in Travel's new Executive Director, Jamie-Lee Abtar, share her goals for the next three years on how the UK travel industry can boost its racial diversity. During the event, which will be sponsored by Barbados Tourism Marketing Inc, BAME Women in Travel will also launch its Corporate Partnerships initiative, which will bring employers together to collaborate and address shared challenges with the aim to drive commitment to diversity in UK workplaces.
